RESOLVED that (a) the Board of Education (the "Board") of the Ellicottville Central School District, Cattaraugus County, New York (the "District") is hereby authorized to undertake a proposed Capital Improvements Project, 2025 (the "Project") consisting of the partial reconstruction, renovation and the construction of improvements and upgrades to various District buildings and facilities and the sites thereof, to implement various health, safety, accessibility and Code compliance measures and various other measures that are included and generally described in (but are not to be limited by) the Project Plan that was referred to in the public notice of the vote on this Proposition, and to expend therefor an amount not to exceed \$2,375,000; (b) a tax is hereby voted in an amount not to exceed \$2,375,000 to finance the estimated maximum cost of the Project, such tax to be levied and collected in installments in such amounts as shall be determined by the collected in installments in such years and in such amounts as shall be determined by the consecute in installments in such years and in such anamounts as small be determined by the Board; (c) in anticipation of south ax, obligations of the District are hereby authorized to be issued in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$2,375,000, and a tax is hereby voted to pay the interest on such obligations as the same shall become due and payable; and (d) New York State Building Aid funds expected to be received by the District in connection with the Project are anticipated to offset a substantial part of such costs, and such funds, to the extent received, shall be applied to offset and reduce the amount of taxes herein authorized to be levied.
