A Message from our Superintendent

By this time of the year, we usually have a fairly accurate estimate of funding from New York State, especially Foundation Aid, for the following year's budget. However, as I shared in the last newsletter, the Governor has proposed drastic changes to the Foundation Aid formula (a formula that has been used for the past several years), while also discontinuing the "Save Harmless" process (a process where the State did not reduce the amount of Foundation Aid a district received). **As a result, under the Governor's proposed budget, the ECS will see an approximate decrease of \$316,000 in Foundation Aid support for the 2024-25 school year.**

There are many unknowns that we are dealing with as we work on the budget such as: the Legislature intervening to negotiate a change and restore some (or possibly all) Foundation Aid; and the final estimates for increases to items such as health insurance, supplies and utilities. As we continue our work, it looks like we will most likely need to exceed the "2% Tax Cap," but we do not know by how much as this point. Please be assured that we will be doing all we can to put together a fiscally responsible budget that will ensure a quality education experience for students at ECS while being cognizant of the impact of the burden an increase in taxes can place on District residents.

I would also like to point out that it is not too late to reach out to our elected officials at the State level to advocate for the restoration of State funding for schools, but such advocacy should take place sooner than later. PETITIONS AVAILABLE FOR THREE (3) SEATS ON THE ELLICOTTVILLE CENTRAL SCHOOL BOARD OF EDUCATION

Nominating petitions for the Ellicottville Central School District Board of Education are now available. The annual election will be held on Tuesday, May 21, 2024. Nominating petitions must be filed with the District Clerk by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, April 22, 2024.

The candidate receiving the highest number of votes will be assigned an unexpired term seat immediately following the election on May 21, 2024, and a five-year term beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2029. The candidate with the second-highest number of votes will be assigned a five-year term seat beginning July 1, 2024 and ending June 30, 2029. The candidate with the third-highest number of votes will be assigned an unexpired term seat immediately following the election on May 21, 2024 and ending on June 30, 2026.

Petitions must contain the signatures and legal addresses of at least 25 qualified voters living in the Ellicottville Central School District. A qualified voter must be a United States citizen, be at least 18 years of age, a district resident for 30 days prior to the election, with their current address on the nominating petition. To qualify as a candidate, one must be a qualified voter and a district resident for one year immediately prior to the election.

Nominating petitions and further information are available from Melissa Sawicki, District Clerk, during regular business hours (when school is in session), 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m., or by calling (716) 699-2368 ext. 1300.
